During her party, Tiny cannot find her best friend Bina and realizes something is wrong, in this comical yet sincere picture book about friendship, understanding and accepting others as they are.



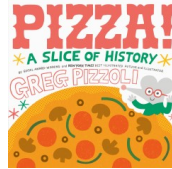

The story of an eager cockroach who gate-crashes a birthday party--with hilarious results.



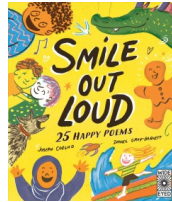
Only One

This environmentally focused picture book follows one girl as she explains the value of the universe and the Earth while leading her friends to a tree-planting ceremony.



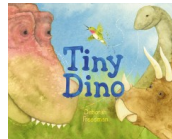
Pizza!: A Slice of History

Tiny Dino

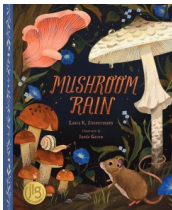

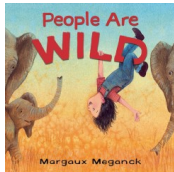
Not That Pet!

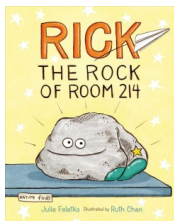
The Path

Our path through life is not only challenging and beautiful--it is all our own to discover and invent. You will walk. You will walk along a well-worn path that many people have taken--and long before you.



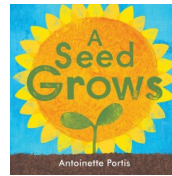
People are Wild

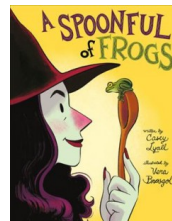
Set Sail for Pancakes!

Little ones are invited to set sail with a grandpa and his intrepid granddaughter as they look far and wide for the perfect pancake ingredients.



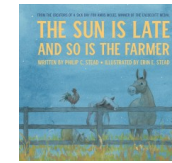
Somewhere in the Bayou

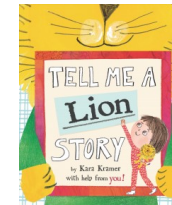
A Spoonful of Frogs
